When Will We Worship Together (Indoors) Again?

This question is on all our minds these days. How exciting it is to know that even now, anticipation is building as we consider when we can once again gather indoors together for worship. Yet, as we consider this question, we also are mindful that the decisions we make affect so many people, including those who now count on online worship each week, as well as our staff who work so hard behind the scenes to make everything happen. The upshot is, we need to keep *everyone* in mind who is affected by our decision to worship in-person indoors once again. Here's who we must keep in mind:

- People who are vaccinated and/or ready to resume normal worship. For those of us in this camp, any delays are hard because we are so tired of being apart and we long to be together again, singing and sharing together.
- People who for many reasons are not yet ready to return. For those of us in this camp, delays are welcome because we would hate to have to choose between our desire to return to worship and our confidence that it is safe.
- People who will never be able to join in-person worship. We who are homebound and others from across the globe who now regularly worship with Mount Olive online are hoping that a return to in-person worship won't leave us behind.
- People who have recently recovered from COVID. Believe it or not, we have had four positive cases of corona virus in the Mount Olive community *in the last month*. Having experienced how debilitating this virus is, we are advocating caution.
- Mount Olive staff members. Those of us on staff have been working for weeks to get online worship ready for Holy Week and Easter. We can't just throw away all those preparations and retool in an instant, and we need time to think about how best to go forward. We need to consider all the new possibilities that online worship have brought to us, sort through them, and come up with a plan for going forward. Believe me, we are excited about a return to in-person worship, but we want to do it well.

As you can see, we must consider many things and keep in mind many people as we decide when the time is right to return to worship. Needless to say the virus/vaccine situation is fluid and things can change quickly. Please

know we will communicate with you regularly as to any plans we have going forward. Meanwhile, we encourage you to continue to invite friends and family to join us online and at Tailgate Worship whenever you can.

Everything You Wanted to Know about Indians But Were Afraid to Ask by Anton Treuer. Treuer (pronounced troy-er) is Professor of Ojibwe at Bemidji State University. He grew up mostly on or near the Leech Lake Reservation, experiencing overt racial discrimination. He writes that Indians are often imagined, but infrequently understood. With this book, he "offers a critical first step to comfortably dispel erroneous imaginings and develop deeper understandings." - *Don Halley*



Four Hundred Souls: A Community History of African America, 1619-2019 by Ibram X. Kendi and Keisha N. Blain. Did you know a boat with kidnapped Angolans reached North American before the Mayflower? The history we learn often leaves out stories of the African community in America. *Four Hundred Souls* covers 400 years of American history from 1916 until the present. 90 different African American authors contribute to this amazing book. Chapters are short, easy to read and cover a key event over each 5 year period. This is a great book to learn about the history of our country from a non-white perspective.

Worship

Maundy Thursday

Virtual worship on Maundy Thursday will be centered around your evening meal, so plan to watch the service as you eat. Our interactive liturgy will begin with the sermon. Then it will guide you through the ritual of eating supper on this night, from washing your hands, to setting the table, to eating while



reflecting on Jesus' meal with the disciples, to clearing the table when the meal is finished. You'll need a candle and some bread and wine/juice for communion as well.

Good Friday

Good Friday worship will be a virtual Tenebrae service. Tenebrae, meaning "darkness," is a service marked by the gradual extinguishing of candles. As we hear the story of Jesus' passion retold on this night by Mount Olive high schoolers, we'll extinguish candles, one by one, and invite you to do the same at home as the service progresses.

Easter Vigil

For Easter Vigil this year we invite you once again to a brief online service followed by a night of prayer. We recommend watching the service at sunset on Saturday, April 3rd (7:40 pm) and encourage you to sign-up to pray at some point in the night. As a community we will keep vigil as we wait for the sun to rise on Easter morning.

The night is divided into 30-minute time slots and covers seven themes that are found in the traditional Easter Vigil readings. Reflection pages will be provided for each theme that include a Bible story, prayer prompts, and links to music online. You can sign up for as many time slots as you wish, and it is okay to have more than one person signed-up at any given time. Did you know that one of the highest rated mentoring programs in the state of Minnesota is located in Mount Olive Lutheran Church? It's true, Bolder Options has had an office in Mount Olive since 2016. We cannot say how much we appreciate all that this congregation has done to help us achieve our mission. Since opening an office in Rochester in 2010, we have served over 250 youth and families. This wouldn't be possible without the support of our wonderful volunteers and community partners.



2020 was a difficult year for everyone and Bolder Options was not immune. We were able to continue programming but had to switch between a hybrid model and distance mentoring. We are excited that we will soon be able to do more in-person activities, especially with spring and sunshine around the corner. 2021 has brought new challenges but we are optimistic we can overcome these. Our mentor recruitment is quite a bit down because of the pandemic and unfortunately youth referrals are way up. Because of this, **we need more mentors**.

We are looking for some special people (age 21+) who care about this community's young people and want to make a difference. As a Bolder Options mentor you will introduce your mentee to a variety of activities. If you like to hangout at a coffee shop, play sports or visit state parks, you will make a great mentor! Mentors spend a couple hours a week in a mix of one on one activities with their youth and group events put on by Bolder Options staff. You will not be do-ing it alone - our staff will be there to support you from day 1. At the end of your year together, you will attend a graduation ceremony in which all of your achievements will be celebrated! Mentoring is one of the most effective ways to give back, and we promise you will get more out of it than you will put in!
