COVID-19 Survival Manuals Coming Your Way

A task force of 8 Mount Olive members and Pastor Glenn has been meeting for the last month to consider ministry opportunities in this pandemic time. The group has considered all sorts of activities in the areas of worship, education, fellowship, and service. In each of these areas, it has been the strong consensus of the group that indoor gatherings with over 10 people is ill-advised. This means that worship, Sunday School, fellowship events, and service events will continue to be done online, by individuals at home, outdoors, or possibly within small 'pods' of people who covenant together to stay safe.

Mindful of the fall coming, which means colder weather, less daylight, and even fewer chances to gather together, the task force is now busy preparing what they are calling "A COVID-19 Survival Manual." This manual will include strategies to gain spiritual resilience for the months ahead. We take seriously the twin threats of isolation and depression that may well plague us while we wait for the arrival of a vaccine. Congregational members will soon receive a survey noting many options that will be considered for inclusion in the manual. Watch for the survey online or in the mail, and share your wisdom on how we all can grow in spiritual resilience during COVID time. Stay well.

the efforts they are making to support their community.







sent out by the SEMN Synod. Here is what it said:



Many things came to a halt when the pandemic hit, but the work of the Holy Spirit wasn't one of them. Olive Branch, an emerging faith community in Rochester, is a testament to the surprising things that can happen when all your plans go out the window. Olive Branch is a ministry that seeks to be church for those who have been hurt by the church, and those who need change to happen more quickly than is often possible in established church communities. They value courageous questions, a lifestyle of wonder, and supporting one another when beliefs change. As churches shifted to online worship, Olive Branch began developing liturgical videos and invited other communities to use them. Currently, 105 leaders across the U.S. and Canada have signed up to receive Olive Branch resources by email.

As we enter into Fall, Pastor Lisa and Cantor Richard are gearing up to develop more worship resources, launch an Olive Branch website, and offer more opportunities to gather online for worship, education and fellowship.

Music Program Begins Plans for Fall

Our program year will be starting soon here at Mount Olive. Ordinarily that would mean choir, brass, and bell rehearsals would resume and we'd all get together and make some music. But how will that work in this time of social distance and staying at home? Here's the preliminary plan for resuming our ensembles.



Choir will rehearse virtually via Zoom. There's no way for us to all sing and hear one another at the same time, so these rehearsals will look and feel a bit different from our typical in-person rehearsals. We'll go over the music one voice part at a time and answer questions. Singers will record their parts at home after sufficient rehearsal time and the final choir piece will be edited together for use in worship videos. Because of the amount of time and effort involved in this process, we won't be able to perform as many pieces as we would normally. We'll be focusing on music for festivals and other occasions: Rally Day, Reformation, All Saints, Thanksgiving Eve, Christmas, etc. If you're interested in participating in choir this year, please contact me via email. Choir members should watch their email inboxes for additional information in the coming weeks.

Bells will rehearse in-person in the Fellowship Hall, socially distanced, wearing masks, one player per table (two players, if they share the same household), so we'll be limited to how many players we can have. As I write this, I've scheduled a test rehearsal for tomorrow evening (July 23) with several of our bell players to see how this will work. Brass will be similar. In-person, in the Fellowship Hall, socially distanced. Obviously, masks won't be doable, but we'll take any other precautions possible to ensure everyone's health.

Again, this is just a preliminary plan. We may discover that some of these practices aren't sustainable or just won't work. We may need to adjust as we go and possibly suspend in-person rehearsals if the situation worsens. Thank you all for your patience in these challenging times. Let me know if you have any questions or concerns.

- **Service in the community** There are still ways that individuals can serve directly in the community. We will provide several options.






Monday Book Group Resumes
