#### **Christmas Eve Services**

Christmas is a time when we get together to celebrate Jesus, the Son of God, coming to earth for all people. While we won't be able to do this in a traditional sense, we have two different worship services planned to help bring hope and joy to this season.

On Christmas Eve, we will offer multiple worship services of Lessons and Carols in the Mount Olive parking lot with a beautiful tree and Christmas decorations as background. We will sing our favorite Christmas music and hear scripture that speaks of the birth of Christ. Each parking lot service will be limited to 50 cars, so you are asked to register ahead of time. We will add a third service if the first two fill up. The service will be broadcast on an FM radio channel, so you may listen from inside your car. People are asked to remain in or next to their cars in order to keep one another safe.

Additionally, we will be offering a more traditional online worship service with Holy Communion on Christmas Eve. Special music from the Bells, Choir, and Brass will help make this service one you won't want to miss. We imagine you starting a fire, having a fresh loaf of bread and wine or juice for communion, and participating in the service with us remotely. Christ promises to be with us as a community of believers, even in a pandemic.

#### **New Mount Olive Task Force Forming**

Over the past 6+ months, through reading, conversation and study, Mount Olive members have been invested in learning more about the history and current realities of racism in our country. This is important work and we give thanks for everyone who has pushed themselves to grow and be challenged, wherever you are on the journey.

Some members have expressed a desire to move their learning into helpful actions, lived out through their church and faith. At their November meeting, the Executive Council approved the development of a task force to begin exploring next steps for Mount Olive. Leadership envisions that this will be a long and thoughtful process with community engagement at a number of levels, similar in many ways to the Inclusive Church Task Force that led Mount Olive through the highly beneficial Reconciling in Christ process a few years ago.

At this point, we are inviting you to reach out if you are interested in helping lead Mount Olive on this next step in our journey of learning about systemic racism and cultivating spaces to consider new ways of living and moving in the world together. #### **COVID-19 Guidance for In-Person Meetings**

In-person meetings at Mount Olive are now limited to 10 people with safety guidelines in place. The guidelines are available on the church website, www.molive.org or by contacting the office. Meetings must be scheduled ahead of time with church staff. Wearing masks, practicing social distance and using hand sanitizer or washing hands frequently are required. If anyone is showing any signs or symptoms of COVID, or has been in contact with anyone who has presumed or confirmed COVID – they should not attend in-person meetings until they are feeling better and have completed the recommended time of isolation. Note that guidelines are subject to change based on local or statewide regulations. Groups will be notified of changes or cancellations. Your cooperation is appreciated!

Help Us Send Christmas Cheer

When the daylight hours are short, the days can seem long, especially when experiencing the isolation so many of us are enduring these days. You are invited to spread a little Christmas cheer by writing notes to those who are more isolated than usual this year – those in congregate living situations where visitors are prohibited, those who can't go out because of health conditions, people who are grieving, those in the military — you get the idea. There are many in our community whose days would be brightened by a cheerful note. To simplify the process, we will be providing pre-addressed cards that you can pick up from the church office. Add a short note, sign your name, and send it along. If necessary, you may return the completed cards to the church office for postage. Cards will be available in the office beginning December 1. Note that the office is generally open Monday-Thursday, 9:00 am—5:00 pm, but there are exceptions, so you may want to call ahead. Thank You!

#### **Tailgate Worship Continues – Weather Permitting**

This year, our Longest Night service will be available online the week prior to Christmas. It will be a meditative service that acknowledges that the season can bring up hard feelings for many of us, particularly this year when we may be more isolated and have fewer distractions.

#### **Christmas Eve Offering**

Rainbow School has been a long-time ministry partner of Mount Olive's. Housed at Zumbro Lutheran Church, it supports families needing affordable daycare, much like our new Early Learning Center at Mount Olive. Due to COVID-19 restrictions, Rainbow School has now been reduced to half its usual student capacity, and their need for increased vigilance in virus control has also brought on new challenges. Their primary need now is to install hand-washing sinks in each of the classrooms, so that students do not need to make constant trips to the bathrooms to wash before and after activities and meals. The cost of this project is \$18, 150. Needless to say, this is well beyond their planned-for expenses. That's where we come in.
