Dear Members of Mount Olive,

Throughout time, women have fought for their rights. This has been especially present in 2017, from the women's marches to countless women speaking out against sexual harassment. These women have made such an impact that in November 2017 "The Silence Breakers" were named TIME Magazine's person of the year. This group consists of some of the women who spoke out and brought attention to sexual harassment in society.

Since its creation, the ELCA has taken a stance on social issues. Twelve statements on various social and justice issues have been published since 1991. In 2009 at the ELCA Churchwide Assembly, a task force was created to begin working on a new social statement regarding Faith, Sexism, and Justice. This task force has since put together a draft of a social statement entitled "Social Statement on Women and Justice", which is very fitting for our society at this moment in time. The creators of this statement are hoping this statement will be considered by the 2019 Churchwide Assembly.

This social statement addresses the injustices women face and how the ELCA intends to respond to these injustices. As part of the ELCA we are given the chance to respond to the draft of the statement before it is considered for publication. We at Mount Olive would like to create a task force to respond to this statement. Please contact me, Kailea Mattheis, at kailea@molive.org ASAP if you would like to join the conversation. 

ELCA Walk for Water

During the Sunday School hour on January 14, you could find the children on their *Walk for Water*. The track set up inside the church was 1/10th of a mile and wound through a flooded river, a

hot desert, and over a bumpy obstacle, with a stop at a clinic that treated water borne diseases such as malaria, worms and lead poisoning. Students started the trek with empty water jugs that were filled along the way. Later, they brought their offerings to the sanctuary where they dropped them into a tin watering can. Students collected coins over a one month time period dropping a coin in their special drinking cup whenever they used water at home. It was a good reminder of how fortunate we are here in Rochester to have clean, safe drinking water. The congregation also participated that morning during the Children's Moment. The children went out into the congregation with offering baskets to collect coins, which were then added to the watering can. It filled to almost overflowing! The offering totaled over \$425. Thank you to everyone who participated!

February Service Spotlight - Mount Olive Quilters

March 2017, a team of 12 Mount Olive members took a trip to visit members of IELCO our partner synod in Bogota, Colombia. We brought with us a large suitcase filled with quilts lovingly made by the Mount Olive Quilters. There were 8 or 9 full size and more than a dozen baby quilts. When we opened the suitcase at the IELCO office, the members there were amazed and overjoyed. "What beautiful blankets!" they told us. "What do you call this kind of craft? We don't have anything like this in Colombia." They had never seen a patchwork quilt before. We gave the quilts to members of IELCO including Bishop Ata and our interpreters and tour guides including Curtis and Katie Kline, our ELCA missionaries. We gave one to a lovely woman, who treated our entire



group to a delicious spaghetti dinner in her home, we handed out small quilts to two different elders living on the hillside of Soacha, an impoverished neighborhood, and we'll never forget the tears in little 90+ year old Estefania as we presented her with a quilt. Thank you to all who donated fabric, pressed and cut, sewed, tied and bound all these blankets. Your loving hands reached to the equator to our neighbors in Colombia, and your beautiful patchwork quilts were a treasure and comfort to many.

Joining the Mount Olive Quilters is one way YOU can get involved in service to others. This group has a well-established process for making quilts that go to Lutheran World Relief as well as many different groups in need. Anyone can participate, from the experienced seamstress to the one who has no sewing experience. The quilters meet **every Thursday morning from 9-11:00 am** in the Fellowship Hall, or you can take a quilt top kit home, and sew on your own time. 
Faith Seeking Understanding (FSU)






Sunday School Offerings
