February Reading Challenge

February is Black History Month - a time to celebrate the influence and achievements of Black Americans who have shaped our country. As part of Mount Olive's commitment to racial justice, we're excited to kick off a year of great book suggestions in the Messenger. Each newsletter will feature two or three books recommended by people in our community. If one of the books catches your eye, maybe it's your next read. At the end of the year, we'll have built a Mount Olive bibliography that has shaped our journey in our work of racial justice.

February 2021 Book Recommendations:

Richard Bruxvoort Colligan -*Jesus and the Disinherited* by Howard Thurman. Howard Thurman was a black preacher, author and mystic of the civil rights era. This book explores the themes of love, hate, fear and deception in a world wrestling with racial injustice and faith. MLK often traveled with this book under his arm. When I discovered him in seminary, I fell in love with his poetry and gentle, thoughtful way of describing monumental things.

Pastor Luke-*The Hate U Give* by Angie Thomas. This young adult novel is a quick and engaging read. Written by Angie Thomas in 2017 and adapted as a film in 2018, it offers a unique perspective from a 16-year-old black girl from a poor neighborhood who attends a private, predominately white school. The narrator, Starr Carter, witnesses a white police officer shoot and kill her childhood friend, and wrestles with the social tensions and events that follows.

Pastor Glenn-**Stand Your Ground** by Kelly Brown Douglas. The author wrestles with questions of social justice and God's justice in the wake of the 2012 killing of Trayvon Martin, a Floridian teenager, and the acquittal of his killer based on "Stand Your Ground" laws.

2021 is Our 60th Anniversary

In February 1960, a Mission Developer, Rev. Don Johnson, of the Board of American Mission of the Augustana Synod of the Lutheran Church, was called to plant a new church in Rochester, Minnesota. Its name was to be Mount Olive Lutheran Church. Rev. Johnson, his wife and four children, arrived in September of that year and led the congregation through the building of its first unit, which broke ground in July 1961. Before the completion of its first unit the congregation met in the Covenant Church on Elton Hills Drive, now the River of Glory Church.



Thank you for Your Year-End Gifts!

As the last months of 2020 approached and the effects of being closed to in-person worship and in-person gatherings of any kind since March began to be felt financially, the Church Council was wondering what kind of decisions might need to be made going forward. Would we need to dip into our reserves? Would we be able to continue our mission support and outreach goals as they had been outlined in the past? Would staff members be expected to go without a cost-of-living adjustment or even asked to reduce hours? We didn't know. What we did know was that the effects of not being open added up to nearly \$40,000 in lost income for the year. **But then you came through!** A number of generous households in the congregation stepped forward to offer matching funds for year-end gifts totalling at least \$11,000. When all was said and done, the sum we had been lacking was almost completely regained through your generosity. Year-end gifts above regular giving totaled nearly \$40,000, including the matching funds! Thank you very much! Your generosity has meant we are on a firm footing financially going forward.

Lenten Offerings to Benefit Global Companions

During the Lenten season this year the Southeastern Minnesota Synod is encouraging all congregations to jump aboard an initiative called *40 Together: 1 Body, 1 Dollar, 40 Days.* Through this project, monies will be raised to support our companions in ministry in Colombia, Tanzania,



and the southern border of the U.S. who are suffering greatly because of COVID-19. Food insecurity is common in these places as work has become scarce and the virus has placed enormous strains on already struggling families. During the season of Lent, every person from every congregation in our synod is asked to give one dollar for every day of the Lenten season. 
Sunday Psalm Prayer Continues


Ripe Olives Zoom with Mayor Kim Norton



White people want to know: Do you say "African-American" or "Black?"

Words are important because they help us understand someone else's reality. Using the descriptive words they prefer is a way to love our neighbor. To honor a person's preferences is an open-hearted way to engage in relationship with them. Preferences vary, but Alisha Harris and Amber Ruffin recently wrote that they prefer "Black". Why? While dark skin connects them genetically to Africa, both women describe their life experience as being far enough removed from their African heritage that a different word is helpful. With several generations of their families born and raised in the United States, they describe their experience as being distinctively Black American.

Family Promise Resumes Hosting Homeless Families

Family Promise is preparing to host families at their new Day Center at 913 1st St. NW. They will be using a Signup Genius link (given below) to organize ALL volunteers. A few additional details:



- There will be just one family in the program at a time. Details regarding the family will be given the week prior.
- Masks are required at all times--by both families and volunteers. This is a very strict rule; families not following the rules will not be allowed to continue in the program.
- Handwashing and social distancing are encouraged. If volunteers do want to eat with the family, know that there are eating areas in two separate rooms.
- It is not required for the family members to be tested for COVID-19 before entering the program. While mask wearing is effective, it isn't 100% effective, therefore it is advised any volunteers 65 or older or volunteers with pre -existing conditions do NOT participate in person at this time.
- There are several options for no-contact volunteers: order a meal to be delivered, make a meal for no-contact drop off, donate a gift card, or donate money or food to another volunteer who could bring/drop off the food.
