This song is, for many people, what "The Twelve Days of Christmas" refers to. Or perhaps they think of the twelve days of Christmas as the last twelve days of the Christmas marketing season, ending on December 25, or maybe December 26 with "after-Christmas sales." But traditionally, Christmas Day doesn't *end* the twelve days of Christmas—it *begins* them. The twelve days, also known as *Twelvetide*, culminate on January 6 with the festival of Epiphany.

In an effort to reclaim some of the tradition associated with the Twelve Days of Christmas, and to provide more opportunities for congregational fellowship, we will be observing a Twelfth Night festival on Friday, January 5. One of the traditions associated with Twelfth Night is the burning of the greens, so we will be kicking off the celebration with the burning of the Christmas tree in the church parking lot. This will be followed by a potluck meal and a time of fellowship and board games, continuing the centuriesold focus on food and drink as part of the festival.

And who knows—there might even be some caroling. A Twelfth Night celebration would hardly be complete without singing "The Twelve Days of Christmas" or "Here We Come A-wassailing." So please plan to join us on January 5 from 5:30-7:30. Bring a dish to share and a board game to play. Hope to see you there!

Hospitality Means Being a "WARM" Person

We sometimes say that someone is a "warm person." We don't mean their body temperature; we mean that they make us feel comfortable by their friendliness. Hospitality is all about being this kind of person, so to help us remember this, memorize this acrostic for the next time you meet someone new in church:

W is for Welcome. Greet the new person with a warm welcome. If you aren't sure if they are a member just say, "I don't think we've met."

A is for Ask. Ask them their name. If it helps, ask them to spell it. Try to attach that name to something memorable about them, like what they are wearing that day.

R is for Relate. Get connected. Find out how they came to Mount Olive or if they have friends or relatives here. Introduce them to your own friends. Invite them to coffee or some other activity.

M is for Make Them Feel Comfortable. Do they need directions? Do they need help during the worship service? Try to "get in their shoes" and understand how they feel as a newcomer. It will make all the difference. You might even make a new friend.

Embrace a New Money Mindset



Special guest, Mia Erickson, a financial planner with Thrivent Financial in Rochester, will be offering a class in January to help us have a new mindset about money. Using the new book, *Your New Money Mindset*, written by Thrivent Financial CEO, Brad Hewitt, and Dr. James

Moline, licensed psychologist, this class seeks to teach us how to replace the tension and fear we feel about money with contentment and peace. Here's what the authors say: "It is not sufficient to focus just on the mechanics of money. We need to start with the heart. In Your New Money Mindset, we examine four spectrums of our relationship with money, and we talk about practical ways that people can start living in the '4 C's' – in Confidence (Freedom), Community, Contentment, and Calling."
