## Project Comfort Coffee June 24/25 to benefit LWR Quilt and Shipping Fund

The Project Comfort Coffee is hosted each year by Ruth Circle to benefit Lutheran World Relief's Quilt and Kit Shipping Fund; this fund is used to help defray the cost of shipping the quilts and kits to people in need all around the world. Members will serve homemade cookies and coffee after each worship service the weekend of June 24<sup>th</sup> and 25<sup>th</sup> and accept a freewill offering for the shipping fund. All offerings collected will go directly to LWR Quilt and Shipping Fund. In 2016, Mount Olive sent 75 quilts at shipping cost of \$2.25 per quilt, 81 baby care kits at a shipping cost of \$1.30 per kit and 90 personal care kits at a shipping cost of \$2.65 per kit. Checks can be made out to WELCA with "Project Comfort" on the memo line and given at the day of the coffee or put in the offering basket during worship at any time. 
### Ugandan Kid's Choir
