Every year I am deeply appreciative of our movement together through Lent and the Easter season and love the variety of resurrection stories we hear before we get to Pentecost. In our worship life together, we are now in what is known as "Year B" of the lectionary scripture cycle. Year B prioritizes Mark's Gospel more than the others, even though it's the shortest of the Gospel stories in the biblical canon. One of the interesting things about Mark's short Gospel is that it really isn't concerned too much with resurrection stories. As it turns out, the earliest gospel manuscripts ended right as the women ran from the tomb, "for they were afraid." And that was it!

Understandably, the early church tried to smooth over such an abrupt ending (especially considering the other gospels included a slew of resurrection sightings, meals, and other accounts). So, a few "bonus" endings to the gospel story were added to tie it up a little more nicely. But there's something about the abrupt, open-endedness of the earlier manuscripts that is a gift for us. It is a gift because it reminds us that resurrection happens in the midst of our fears, and that even when we are afraid, we are beckoned onwards to see where the risen Christ might meet us next.

Indeed, the spirit of the risen Christ **is** meeting us as we go, always! We will proclaim this Pentecost story and tradition in celebratory fashion on the festival of Pentecost, which will be on Sunday, May 20th, this year. So, to prepare for the Spirit Fire to illuminate our lives, be sure to wear your fieriest colors (reds, oranges, and yellows) to worship that day, as together we proclaim the divine presence of God sending us forth into the world each day that we live!





The Market as God – A Spring Book Study
