Dear Siblings in Christ,

I am into my last months of full-time course work at Trinity Seminary in Ohio! It has been a good semester and a wonderful second year overall. This January I was fortunate to spend my 3-week J-term in the Holy Land with classmates and my New Testament professor. We spent time in Tel Aviv, Galilee, Bethlehem, and Jerusalem. While I loved the Old City of Jerusalem (especially their delicious falafel sandwiches!), my favorite moment from the trip took place on the Sea of Galilee. We were able to take a boat ride out onto the sea, and while we were on the water we celebrated the Eucharist. It was a beautiful and memorable way to give thanks for the grace that Christ gives freely to us each day.



Currently, my classmates and I are preparing for what is next to come in our 4-year program: Internship. This next part of our program will have us serving in congregational settings for the next 2 years, where we will take a few online and intensive classes to finish our course loads while simultaneously working roughly 30 hours per week as



intern pastors. It has been an anxious but exciting time as we have interviewed and awaited the finalization of our placement sites, but I am thrilled to finally announce that I will be interning at Faith Lutheran Church in Arlington, VA! I am so excited for this next part of the journey, and I continue to be ever grateful for the support and prayers that come from all of you back home.

Every six years the synod elects a new bishop to lead the 171 congregations of the Southeast MN Synod of the ELCA. As many of you know, Pastor Glenn is one of the seven nominees that was endorsed by conference assemblies in March. He will now be on the panel of nominees who will be part of three discernment conversations to be held in Waseca, Zumbrota, and Stewartville on May 13, 14, and 16. The final conversation is May 16, 6:30 pm at Zion Lutheran in Stewartville. The actual election is at the Synod Assembly May 31-June 1 at the Mayo Civic Center. Students generally eat outdoors these days. Because this is a crucial part of the campus, and

Mount Olive Softball Team Begins Play


