

## Giving and Receiving

As our team headed to Tanzania in September we had five main goals in mind which we hoped to achieve through our visit there:

- 1) Renew our relationship with our companion congregation in Kijota.
- 2) Get an update and overview of the Kijota Hull High School.
- 3) Get an update and overview of the Lutheran Bible Institute at Kiomboi.
- 4) Form a stronger relationship with the Central Diocese in Singida and worship at the Immanuel Cathedral there.
- 5) Have a sewing day in Kijota on a project wherein Tanzanian and American women would work together.

All of these goals were met beyond expectations! God is so good!!

We spent many hours on Friday and Sunday with the people of our companion congregation in Kijota, both giving and receiving gifts, eating together, praying together, worshipping together.

We spent a good portion of one day meeting the students, faculty, and staff of Kijota Hull High School. We toured the campus, enjoyed a program and Q&A session led by the students, had much conversation with the staff about our partnership, and enjoyed a meal together. We were delighted to hear that the student body has grown to 170 students, and hopes to grow to 250 residential students soon.

We lived for part of 3 days at the Lutheran Bible Institute at Kiomboi (LBIK), where members of our team worked extensively on the computers and technology while Pastor Glenn taught two lectures on preaching to 72 students. We learned that the eager students and excellent faculty would greatly benefit from an expanded partnership with us.

We met with many members of Bishop Alex Mkumbo's staff, as well as having two meetings with the bishop. We enjoyed a wonderful children-led service at Immanuel Cathedral.

Our sewing day in Kijota was a big hit, as the ladies on our team worked with 50 Kijota women on sewing stoles for the new graduates of the Lutheran Bible Institute at Kiomboi. These stoles will be finished by our Mount Olive quilters and given to graduates by our bishop in December.

We gave gifts. We received abundantly, far beyond our expectations. As the Tanzanians say, "Mungu umwema wakate wa wote, wakate wa wote Mungu umwema." God is good all the time. All the time, God is good!

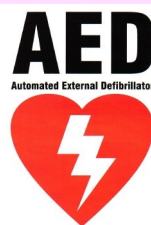
## Congregational Meeting Report

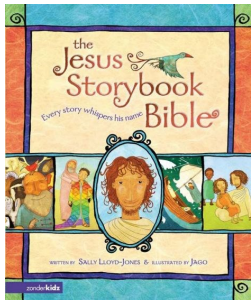




## All Saints Observance

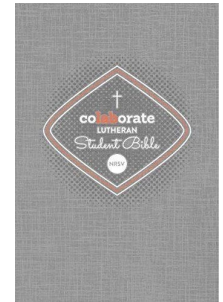

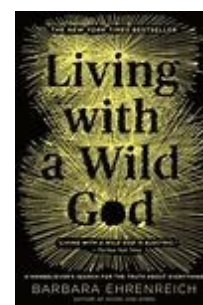
## Men's Discipleship

## Youth Boards Re-Forming

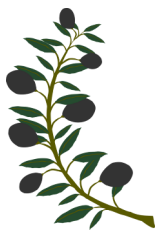

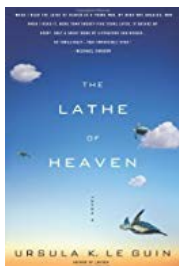
