#### This Day in Mount Olive History

November 5, 1960 was an historic day in the life of Mount Olive. It was the day when the congregation was officially organized. In that year the Augustana Synod (which in 1962 joined with other Swedish-American Lutherans to become the Lutheran Church in America) planted two new churches in Rochester: Mount Olive on the north side, and Good Shepherd on the south side of Rochester. Pastor Don Johnson was called by the synod as the mission developer and the congregation began by people worshipping together in homes. In the fall of that year, the fledgling congregation began worshipping at the local Covenant Church on Elton Hills Drive (now River of Glory).



The 60<sup>th</sup> anniversary leadership team wishes to thank everyone who worked, donated food, attended, and/or helped out in any way to make the Dining for the Dining Hall event on November 1 a success. It was our first attempt at providing a community meal of this type. It was quite a chal-

lenge, and we learned a lot in doing it. Stay tuned for the report on how we did in raising funds for the needed dining hall at Hull High School in Kijota, Tanzania. Our goal is to raise the needed \$30,000 by year's end.

## Mission Colombia 2020

A group of Mount Olive members will be taking a mission trip to Colombia, South America March 26-April 4, 2020. Our goals are to connect more deeply with the Colombian Church, IELCO, which is located in Bogota, and with our

partner congregation, Emanuel in Paz de Ariporo. There is room for a maximum of 14 individuals, and teenagers are encouraged to come with a parent. The cost of the trip is estimated at \$1500-\$2000. In November, we will plan fundraising and have more specific information about the trip. All mission participants will need a valid passport.

## All Saints Worship is November 2-3

One of the most important festivals in the church year is the Festival of All Saints. This is an ancient festival which began as early Christians observed the anniversary of the death of early martyrs during the Roman persecutions of Christians in the 2<sup>nd</sup> century. By the 4<sup>th</sup> century it was celebrated throughout the church during the Easter season, but it was Pope Gregory III (731-741) who established November 1 as the official

feast day when he consecrated a chapel in St. Peter's Basilica to all the martyrs. Today, both Protestant and Roman Catholic churches celebrate this festival on the first Sunday in November, reciting the names of those in their number who have died, and lighting candles in their memory. This year, those whose names will be read at Mount Olive include: Roger Carlson, Lou Everett, DuWayne Forbord, Marion Heram, and Linda Sheffield. Blessed be their memory amongst us.
