#### "Compelled by God's Love" to Give

Our theme this year is "Compelled by God's Love." The inspiration for this theme has been 1 John 4:19: "We love because God first loved us." As we reflect on this theme, we hope to deepen our walk with Christ in each of our four "pillars": Worship, Service, Education, and Fellowship. We believe we are compelled by God's love to worship, to serve, to learn, and to live in community.

This theme could also be our Stewardship theme for this fall. We are blessed beyond measure at Mount Olive with abundant resources for our own needs. With that in mind, we are compelled by God's love to now concentrate on extending our ministry *beyond* our walls. This fall, as you reflect on how God's love is compelling you to give beyond our walls, we invite you to consider how increasing our mission giving by \$25,000 could accomplish the following:

- \$10,000 would enable us to 1) grant scholarships to students at Lutheran schools; 2) support pastors studying at the School of Theology in Bogota; 3) give monthly support to our missionaries in Colombia, Curtis and Katie Kline; and 4) give generous general support to the overall education ministry of the Lutheran Church of Colombia.
- \$3,000 would enable us to support our newest neighborhood ministry partner, Gage East Empowerment Center, as they seek to provide housing and social services to those families experiencing chronic homelessness in Rochester.
- \$2,000 would provide support to the new youth outreach center, The Refuge, through Next Chapter Ministries, our ministry partner serving persons impacted by crime.
- \$10,000 would enable us to increase our mission support to the ELCA, through which we are supporting the global ministries of the church. This would put us on the path of being, once again, one of the leading mission congregations in our region.

Is God's love compelling us to these new ventures? We believe it is. Please pray about how God's love is compelling *you* to join in this outreach beyond our walls. Stewardship Weekend is October 14-15. On that weekend you will be asked to make your intentions known as we go forward together.

#### God's Work. Our Hands. 2017- Service Accomplished!

*God's work. Our hands.* Sunday, Sept. 10 was an exciting sea of gold shirts at Mount Olive, with members aged 18 months to 80+, organized to accomplish 16 different projects. By 2:00 pm, we had accomplished the following:

- 23 colored and created 4 creation baby quilts to be donated to tiny patients at Rochester Methodist Hospital.
- 25 created 30+ cards for fire fighters and EMTs.
- 8 harvested 36 pounds of produce from the Mount Olive Garden.
- 17 made 300 turkey and cheese sandwiches for Love One Another in the Twin Cities.
- 25 rolled 247 cloth bandages for Global Health Ministries.
- 12 quilters tied 10 quilts for NAMI SE MN.
- 10 knitted 40+ hats for local schools and children in Colombia.
- 16 assembled 15 care kits for Next Chapter Ministries.
- 16 assembled 30+ baggies for the homeless to be distributed through the local Salvation Army.
- 31 cut and tied 22 twin size fleece blankets (in 2 hours!) to be distributed through the local Salvation Army.
- 11 tore down & constructed walls, sanded floors, installed lights, etc. at the Next Chapter Ministries new Youth Center.
- 13 weeded and bagged 12 yard bags full of weeds at the Family Promise Day Center.
- 14 sang and played piano at The Homestead.
- 31 baked and/or delivered cupcakes, drinks and thank you notes to the 5 local Fire Stations and 1 Gold Cross Station
- Advocacy letters were written on issues of child hunger, the environment, international aid, and migration to be sent to Washington, D.C.
- 13 prepared and served lunch for 140 hungry volunteers.
- Thrivent donated \$250 to seven of these projects for a total of \$1750.00! Thank you Thrivent! In addition, \$235 was donated from the Darrell Sanden memorial fund to purchase fleece.

Thank you to everyone who came to serve! As one volunteer put it, "participating in this event was very fulfilling and rewarding".

#### **October Service Sunday**

October marks the beginning of the Second Sunday of Service opportunities that occur 6 times during the program year. Even the youngest students learn about serving others in Jesus' name. On Sunday, **October 8**, the project will be putting together **Blizzard Boxes**; boxes of emergency food supplies for seniors, a program sponsored by Lutheran Social Services. #### Lutheran World Relief Personal Care Kits

In October we will be collecting items for Personal Care Kits to help our neighbors around the world. Lutheran World Relief's supply of Personal Care Kits remains critically low as requests for assistance across the world increase. These kits contain basic hygiene supplies that help reduce the spread of germs and disease. They are sent around the world to people dealing with the effects of war, disaster and poverty. Personal Care Kits not only send a tangible message of God's love amidst suffering, they also save lives by helping families stay healthy in difficult living conditions. If you are willing to donate to help others around the world **the following items are needed to complete a kit: 1 lighter weight bath size towel (approximately 52" x 27"), 2 bath size bars (4-5 oz.) of soap, 1 adult size toothbrush, 1 sturdy comb, 1 metal nail clippers. You may drop off items in the Gathering area in the Lutheran World Relief box anytime in October.**






#### **Ripe Olives**
