#### What is this Ministry?

The Alternative Learning Center (ALC) is a Rochester Public school for students who are working, parenting, in recovery, or have other special needs. These students are striving to move their lives along by earning their high school diplomas. As young adults, they often have a difficult road, but have dedicated themselves to completing their education so they can become independent, responsible adults in our community.

#### How do we help?

When school is in session, the ALC student closet needs some new or gently used clothing including leggings, hoodies, and t-shirts, as well as a variety of personal care items. We gather these items to assist these young adults.

#### To Get Involved:

## **Channel One Regional Food Bank**

#### What is this Ministry?

Channel One Regional Food Bank is a non-profit organization whose mission is to work in partnership with others to help feed people in need. In 2019, 1263 pounds of food and \$2322 were collected during the Mount Olive annual Lenten Food Drive. Mount Olive was ranked 6th in the state in giving by Minnesota Food Share.

#### How do we help?

- During Lent 2020, Mount Olive will have its annual food drive to collect food items for people in need. We also have a special offering for Channel One during Lent as well as at the Thanksgiving Eve service.
- Our budget for this ministry is \$500.00.

#### To Get Involved:

Mount Olive always has a Channel One barrel for non-perishable foods in the front entry. Watch for the special collection during Lent. Check out Channel One's website: www.channel-one.org.

#### What is this Ministry?

Dorothy Day (1897-1980) began serving people experiencing homelessness in the 1930's in response to the

Great Depression and the resulting devastating culture of homelessness and poverty. To this day, Dorothy Day houses offer shelter and food for homeless people.

#### How do we help?

Volunteers are needed on the first Friday of each month from 5pm – 7pm to cook, serve the meal, pray, and eat with those staying at the Dorothy Day House (up to 25 people).

#### To Get Involved:

## **Family Promise**

#### What is this Ministry?

Family Promise (Formerly Interfaith Hospitality Network) is a network of more than 40 faith communities that work together to provide food, shelter and loving support when a family finds itself without shelter. More than 1,400 volunteers work within the network to provide nightly housing, meals and support. Family Promise staff provide the support and case management to assist the families as they seek sustainable employment and permanent housing. The program operates 365 days a year and can accommodate 14 people.



Host churches usually house families for one week at a time. Churches that are unable to house families also supply volunteers to help serve.

#### How do we help?

Mount Olive hosts families four weeks during the year. Look for dates to be announced. Volunteers provide hospitality in the evening and overnight as they stay in our specially prepared rooms. Volunteers help by cooking and serving food, playing with the families with young children, staying overnight, or driving families to and from Mount Olive.

#### To Get Involved:

All volunteers must be trained with the exception of those helping with set-up and tear-down. Recertification is required every 3 years. Instead of having to go in person to update your training, you now have the option of doing your recertification online via their website at: familypromiserochester.org. Click on "Get involved" and then "Volunteer." You simply need to watch the video and fill out the form verifying that you watched it. First time volunteers must still go in-person to their training. Contact Jason if you would like to volunteer, but haven't been trained.

### **Food For Friends**

#### What is this Ministry?

Channel One coordinates this program that provides bags of food each week to students at John Adams Middle School. The Food for Friends program discreetly provides nutritious, child-friendly, easy-to-prepare food to chronically hungry children. The food is distributed in ordinary bags for students to take home over the weekends and out-of-school times.

#### How do we help?

Mount Olive volunteers work with Channel One to portion and distribute bags containing food each week during the school year. Last year, Mount Olive filled and delivered 35-55 bags of food each week. The food is packed on Wednesday evenings and delivered to school on Thursday to be sent home. This year volunteers will also be including brief encouraging notes in each food bag.

#### To Get Involved:

Sign up in the Gathering Area to pack and/or deliver food. Food distribution begins in late September.



#### What is this Ministry?

"God's work. Our hands." Sunday is an opportunity to celebrate who we are as the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America – one church, freed in Christ to serve and love our neighbor. For the last four years, Mount Olive has participated in this special day of service. Service activities offer an opportunity for us to explore one of our most basic convictions as Lutherans, that every act of service flows freely from a living, daring confidence in God's grace. The enthusiasm and energy of Mount Olive members on this special service day is extraordinary.

#### How do we help?

Mount Olive members, friends, and visitors of all ages can participate in 14 different projects on September 8, 2019 including; making birdhouses and bird feeders, quilting for the Women's Shelter, assembling blizzard bags for Family Service Rochester Meals on Wheels, making sandwiches for the Salvation Army, rolling bandages for Global Health Ministries, painting bowls for Channel One's Empty Bowls fundraiser, assembling Care Kits for Next Chapter Ministries, making cookie dough for the Open Table food truck, tying fleece blankets for the Salvation Army, and singing for residents at the Homestead. Also included, volunteers will have the opportunity to sign letters to our US Senate and House in support of Global Nutrition Resolutions S. Res. 260 and H. Res. 189. These will be prayed over during the service on September 15.

#### To Get Involved:

Planning begins months in advance to choose projects and begin working out details for "God's work. Our hands." Sunday. Volunteers are needed for the following tasks: project coordinators, applying for grants, gathering supplies, helping with promotion, or volunteering on the day of the event. ## Rochester Youth Services (formerly known as LINK)

#### What is this Ministry?

LSS—Rochester Youth Services (RYS) is a transitional living program for young adults age 16-24. It helps keep youth and children safe and supports their healthy development by providing:

- Early intervention and prevention services
- Supportive shelters and housing options for youth experiencing homelessness
- Services to restore and strengthen families

The goal of this program is to support at-risk youth while they establish and maintain an independent household, and prevent future occurrences of homelessness.

#### How do we help?

In August, a School Supply Drive was organized to collect much needed items for young adults and their children being supported by LSS–RYS. Items collected included 50 backpacks plus an array of school supplies.

#### To Get Involved:

Donate items throughout the school year, including: Kleenex, toilet paper, Wet Wipes, full size shampoo, conditioner, body wash, toothpaste and toothbrushes, Ziplock bags (gallon and quart size), new underwear and socks (kids and adult sizes), new pillows, and \$5 gift cards for Subway. Leave gift cards in the office drop box and label -"For LSS-Rochester Youth Services". Drop all other items in the LSS—RYS collection bin in the Mount Olive Office.



## **Mitten Tree**

#### What is this Ministry?

With colder weather approaching, many children will be searching their closets for winter gear and coming up short. The goal of this ministry is to help kids stay warm over the winter by providing them with appropriate gear.

#### How do we help?

We help by providing all types of warm winter gear: sweatshirts, coats, mittens, hats, wool socks, snow boots, and pants that are needed by our Rochester school children. Items donated to the Mount Olive Mitten tree are distributed locally to kids in need.

#### To Get Involved:

You may place gently used or new (grade school sized) coats, snow pants, snow boots, hiking boots, wool socks, hats and/or mittens under or on the tree. ## **Neighborhood Schools**

#### What is this Ministry?

Mount Olive has a special relationship with our neighborhood school, Elton Hills Elementary. We have provided low income students with dozens of coats, boots, gloves, and other items they need. We also are active in the Reading Buddy program which matches our members with children who need extra help. We sponsor a staff appreciation effort during the school year to remind the faculty and staff how much we appreciate their work. During Elton Hills Summer School 2018, Mount Olive volunteers conducted miniclasses on arts, crafts, poetry, and games.

#### How do we help?

When the school calls with a need, we gather supplies. When the time comes to sign up Reading Buddies, we get the word out. When it's time to support those who work at Elton Hills, we have taken on a variety of projects to help, including making snowflakes that the teachers used as an incentive for students.

#### To Get Involved:

Anyone can donate gently used or new items for elementary age students: coats, snow pants, gloves, boots (especially youth small) and clothing, such as elastic waist pants in all sizes, underwear, or socks. If you have anything to donate, please bring it to the church and put the item in the "Neighborhood Schools" bin below the sign-up sheets in the Gathering Area and we will deliver the item to the school. You may also call Elton Hills or go to their website and sign up to be a Reading Buddy. Our goal is to help support students so they can thrive at school. #### What is this Ministry?

Next Chapter Ministries is a network for changing lives. Their mission is to build lasting relationships with those in the Olmsted County community who have been impacted by crime, restoring them to God, family, and community with the Gospel of God. Their program includes mentoring adults one-on-one, encouraging participants to be involved in church and community events, conducting regular Bible study and support groups, supporting individuals as they work towards attaining goals, as well as providing housing that offers a family environment and opportunities for personal growth. In addition, they build and maintain a network of support for participants and advocate for and practice restorative justice.

#### How do we help?

Members of Mount Olive are involved as mentors, as helpers in areas of maintenance of their properties, as Bible study helpers with Pastor Glenn, and with donations for various ministry needs. You can also donate used clothing, shoes and other items by placing it in the NP Community collection bin in the Mount Olive parking lot. All proceeds from this go to Next Chapter. Mount Olive members attend the Next Chap-

ter banquet and donate funds to support their ministries.

#### What is this Ministry?

The Salvation Army of Rochester's mission has been to preach the gospel of Jesus Christ and to meet human needs in his name without discrimination. Some of the ways they do this are through offering a free meal program, providing affordable housing to at-risk families, the Good Samaritan Dental and Health Clinics, and running the Caring Partners licensed adult day program.

#### How do we help?

Groups of Mount Olive members ring bells each Christmas season for the Red Kettle Campaign. Volunteers spread Christmas cheer while helping to raise money that will make a difference in the lives of people in crisis for food and housing programs, after-school activities for at-risk kids, and more. During God's work. Our hands. Sunday, Mount Olive members made 300 sandwiches for their lunch program and will be collecting sleeping bags and blankets. Mount Olive also has an ongoing collection of hotel sized toiletries which are donated to the SA.

### **Mission Colombia**

After a team of 12 Mount Olive members traveled to Bogota in March 2017, the leadership of Mount Olive and the leadership of the Lutheran Church of Colombia (IELCO) developed a covenantal agreement which was approved by the Mount Olive Church Council, the ELCA Global Mission Group, the SE MN Synod, and the bishop and executive committee of IELCO. This agreement provides goals and structure for ongoing communication, visits, prayer, financial support and education. In 2020, we plan to return to Colombia to meet with IELCO leaders, strengthen our relationship with our companion congregation, Lluvia de Gracia (Rain of Grace), and learn how best to deepen our companion relationship with our siblings in Christ in Colombia. Our particular concern is for the education of church leaders, both lay and ordained, in Colombia and how to best support that aspect of IELCO's ministry.

#### How do we help?

Mount Olive sends Christmas cards and pictures to our companion congregation Lluvia de Gracia. We remember members of Lluvia de Gracia in prayer during our weekly worship. Through our financial gifts we support students attending Lutheran schools through the Emmaus Road Foundation, and we also support the IELCO School of Theology (for pastors) as well as the general education ministry of IELCO.

#### To Get Involved:

Talk to Carrie or Terry Krieger, Sherry Will – Director of Missions and Service, or Pastor Glenn Monson, especially if you are interested in being part of the team going to Colombia in 2020. ## **Mission Tanzania**

#### What is this Ministry?

In Fall 2018, five Mount Olive members traveled to central Tanzania. The team set five goals which were to: Renew our relationship with our companion congregation in Kijota; Get an update and overview of the Kijota Hull High School; Get an update and overview of the Lutheran Bible Institute in Kiomboi; Form a stronger relationship with the Central Diocese in Singida; Have a sewing day in Kijota on a project wherein Tanzanian and

American women would work together. All of these goals were met beyond expectations! God is good all the time! Our goal for 2019-20 is to work as a congregation to raise funds for the building of a new dining hall at Hull School in Kijota at a cost estimate of \$30,000. Years ago, Mount Olive built the current dining hall which is large enough for 30 students. Currently, the student population at Hull has grown to 225 students with many on the waiting list.



#### How do we help?

Since the teams return in October 2018, communication has continued between Mount Olive and the Central Diocese of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Tanzania (ELCT) and action has been taken on needs identified while the team was in Tanzania, including: the Mount Olive church council's vote in 2019 to provide \$3,000.00 to Hull High School in Kijota to pay off student debt for graduates whose diplomas were being withheld. This money was then used to begin the building of a new student dorm. The council also voted to cover tuition for five students in the amount of \$2,625.00/year for the 2019, 2020 and 2021 school years. Mount Olive also

provides funds for a yearly subscription to high speed internet for the Lutheran Bible Institute at Kiomboi (LBIK) as an annual gift to the institute. In 2019, we also gave funds to purchase 10 computers and 2 projectors for LBIK. These were installed in July 2019. The women of Mount Olive finished the 24 pastors' stoles that were started by the women of Kijota, then the stoles were sent back to be presented to the newly ordained pastors who graduated from LBIK. In addition, offerings have been given by various

Mount Olive groups and a large Christmas card signed by Mount Olive members was sent to Kijota Parish.

#### To Get Involved:

Pray for our partner congregation in Kijota. Support Tanzanian projects that the mission team has identified during their time there. Support the fundraising efforts to build a dining hall for Hull High School by participating in the fundraisers

### **Lutheran World Relief**

#### What is the Ministry?

Lutheran World Relief (LWR) is a non-profit organization that works with local partners to provide lasting solutions to poverty, injustice, and human suffering.

#### How do we help?

Mount Olive supports LWR by sponsoring:

- **Baby Care Kits** We have a long history of our Sunday School Youth assembling the Baby Care Kits. Again, the supplies are provided by the congregation and kits are assembled between services. After a blessing during worship, they are sent to the LWR warehouse in the Twin Cities to be shipped overseas.
- **Personal Care Kits** For the past few years, from the supplies provided by the congregation during promotion time, our youth assemble the kits. After a blessing during worship, they are sent to the LWR warehouse in the Twin Cities to be shipped overseas.
- **Quilts** Quilts not only provide comfort, but also provide an object that is useful in imaginative ways including a baby carrier, a sunshade, a shawl and most importantly a constant reminder that someone far away cares a lot. (For more information on quilts, see page 14.)

#### To get involved:

- **Donate** items as needed for the kits or fabric and thread for the quilters. Monetary donations are also used to buy batting in bulk.
- Quilters meet weekly on Thursday mornings at 9:00 am to assemble and tie quilts and sew the bindings. No sewing experience is required to participate.
- **Sewing** at home: Quilt top packages, baby jackets, and blankets can be picked up in the Gathering Area cabinets. Return completed items to the LWR cabinet in the Gathering Area. If you are a knitter, check with Cathy Hanson (contact information above) about knitting baby hats to go with hoodless jackets that are made.
- **Project Comfort:** In June or July a weekend is designated for "Project Comfort". Donations made during this weekend are sent to LWR to help pay for shipping all of the quilts and kits overseas. Current shipping costs are: one quilt-\$2.25, one Personal Care Kit-\$2.65, one Baby Care Kit-\$1.30. A gift of \$100 will ship 44 quilts or 37 Personal Care Kits or 76 Baby Care Kits. In 2019, enough funds were raised to cover all of the shipping costs for the quilts and kits made at Mount Olive.
