Immanuel taught me much about parish ministry and crystalized my sense of call, and in 2016 I was commissioned as an Associate in

Ministry.

During my tenure at Immanuel, I met my wife, Samantha. A native Minnesotan, Sam grew up in Winona, the youngest of three sisters. She studied Business, Banking, and Finance at Waldorf University in Forest City and currently works in Waldorf's Business Office. In her spare time, she enjoys movies, art, theater, and hanging out with friends. Born with a bowling ball in her hand, she has been an active league bowler in Forest City, rolling two 700 series games in the last several years. I'd like to say that her bowling talent is contagious and has improved my own bowling scores. But it's not...and it hasn't... :)

# **Tanzania Connection Revived!**

The Southeast MN synod has enjoyed a long and valued relationship with the Lutherans of the Central Diocese in Tanzania, and Mount Olive has been a part of that relationship with our sister congregation and the Vivian Gulleen school in Kijota. Mount Olive and our members helped to provide a new roof for our sister church and helped with operational costs and classrooms for the girls school in Kijota. In the fall of 2007, a small group from Mount Olive travelled to central Tanzania in order to understand and document the technology sustainability of the Lutheran schools and hospitals there. We also spent time in Kijota and renewed our Mount Olive relationship with the amazing people of that area. In 2011, another small group from Mount Olive travelled to central Tanzania to provide gifts of 20 laptop computers to four locations. We recently heard that these computers are still being used and are cherished.

Where are we now? The current priority for the churches in Tanzania is education and health in their area. In this light, our Mount Olive church council recently voted that our annual gift to Tanzania will provide the Kiomboi Bible Institute with a satellite dish and a one year subscription to high speed internet. This is a much celebrated gift at the school since a major need for them is access to the latest educational materials and teachers. Mark Masbruch, a Mount Olive member who travelled to Tanzania in 2007 and 2011, recently joined the Tanzania Operations Team (TOT) of the SEMN synod. He will help us better understand the educational needs in the central diocese of Tanzania and ensure the best use of Mount Olive's gift.

Where are we going? Mount Olive plans for a trip to visit to central Tanzania in late 2018 to renew our relationship with the people, and to further understand how we can help them meet their educational needs. ### **Mount Olive Quilters**


Thursday mornings at 9:00 am in the Fellowship Hall You are invited each week to enjoy quilting and fellowship!





#### **Monday Book Group**



Conversations in June helped us first think about our own stories of welcome and exclusion and those in July centered on the things Mount Olive does well as a welcoming church and suggestions for doing even better.
