# ... celebrate the 'aha moments'

Epiphany is often known as "a season of light." This is because epiphany comes from the Greek word for "appearing" or "giving light" or "being revealed." I like to think of Epiphany as the season when we celebrate the "aha moments" that came to God's people as they first encountered the Christ: the adoration of the magi, the voice from heaven at Jesus' baptism, and Christ's first sign when he turned water into wine at the wedding at Cana, among others.

At Mount Olive we will be observing the season of Epiphany in another way as well. As your new senior pastor I continue to seek ways for you to *enlighten* me as to what God has put on your heart as a member of Mount Olive. I am seeking to understand what God's calling is for this congregation as we go forward together. With that in mind, on the weekend of January 9 and 10, you will be handed a questionnaire as you enter worship, having just two questions:

- 1. As a member of Mount Olive, **what do you** *receive*? (i.e. What ministries, activities, relationships, or opportunities are gifts to you as a member of this congregation?)
- 2. As a member of Mount Olive, **what do you** *give*? (i.e. In what ways are you enabled to give gifts to others by virtue of your membership in this community of faith?)

The Christian life is like breathing: we exhale and we inhale, we give and we receive. When we do both deeply we live well and we serve well. God bless you in your giving and in your receiving.

### **Mount Olive Financial Update**

(note: 2015 Giving must be received by noon, Dec. 31)

We want to extend a huge thank you to each person in our community of faith for their dedication to share the love of God. Thank you for continuing to be generous in offering your time, talents and resources!

Our congregation supports a wide variety of ministries. In addition to prayer and volunteer hours, this important work requires a strong financial commitment. To date (2015) our expenses are greater than the amounts pledged and received. We have a **deficit** of **\$32,000** so far.

The Finance Team has found funds within the church's accounts to cover this year's deficit, but this is not sustainable.

Next year's anticipated expenses, again, will probably exceed income by \$31,000 – and this includes a 50% cut in benevolence, a substantial cut to our programming budgets and a reduction in staff benefits.

We have staffed for growth and for a greater impact in our community. Without additional giving, we will not be able to support this.

As we move forward with our mission, please consider increasing your giving to support our current goal of maintaining our vision of ministry and stewardship that is woven into the fabric of Mount Olive Lutheran Church.

### Walk For Water

Water is a major part of our life in church. In the waters of baptism, we are born again as children of God. Many of the decorations in a church have images of water –streams, rivers, rain. The Bible is filled with stories of water. Many of the people in the Bible lived in very dry parts of the world. Having water meant everything to them. Water – too much of it, too little of it, just enough of it – was one way they saw God acting in the world. God blessed the people by sending rain to water their fields. Jesus promised that people who followed him would never thirst. John the Baptist and followers of Jesus used water to mark people in baptism, and floods were seen as God's judgment.



Water is still very important to us. For many people in the world – more than 780 million – lacking water is a fact of life.

Sunday School students in grades 6 through 8 are leading Mount Olive's participation in the ELCA World Hunger's Walk For Water. They will educate other Sunday School classes and the Mount Olive congregation with a simulated "Walk For Water" in January, date TBA.
