P: Holy God, holy and mighty, holy and immortal, C: have mercy on us.

These words stand at the center of our worship together on Ash Wednesday, marking the beginning of the liturgical season of Lent. The thought of asking for God's mercy can seem like an unnecessary appendage of an age long past, but I tend to see this pleading for mercy as more of a recognition that we continue to be people who are in need: in need of peace, in need of sustenance, in need of guidance, in need of one another, and indeed, in need of God. As we enter into this season, Lent uniquely invites us to open our lives to the presence of Christ walking with us, as we move together towards the Cross, and beyond, to Resurrection Sunday (Easter).

This journey towards the cross takes us through many scripture stories this Lenten season. The Gospel texts proclaimed in our weekend worship include the temptation of Jesus, the death threats of King Herod, the tragedy at Siloam, and the parable of the father whose lost son returns. Pastor Glenn's Bible study on Sundays and Wednesdays will open us to the Apostle Paul and his letter to the Philippians, as we learn what it means to be joyful in Christ, and, on Wednesdays during Holden Evening Prayer, a courtroom drama will be performed as we ponder the free grace and justice of God.

Throughout this season, it is my hope that God's movement of death to life will be found in our own lives, individually and as the whole people of God.

There is much richness to wade in together in these weeks to come.


Lenten Season Brings Drama!

This drama will be done each Wednesday night as part of the Holden Evening Prayer service which will comprise the remainder of the worship. Sunday Forum to Highlight Spiritual Disciplines



The season of Lent at Mount Olive this year will be following a decidedly 'un-Lenten' theme as we lift up the joy we have in Christ. The vehicle for this reflection of our joy in Christ will be the



Apostle Paul's letter to the Philippians. This letter is Paul's most joyful letter, written to the fledgling church at Philippi in Macedonia (modern day Greece) in the mid-to-late 50's C.E. The development of the emerging structure of the early Church is in evidence in this letter as we encounter the terms "bishop" and "deacon" for the first time. While Paul spends some time warning about those who might be enemies of the gospel, the letter is filled with exhortations to joy, even in the most difficult circumstances.

Pastor Glenn will be leading this study of Philippians Sundays (February 14 – March 20) at 9:15 am, and Wednesdays (February 17 – March 23) at 6:00 pm. Sign up in the front entrance. Study guides are available for \$7 each. Please come!

Mount Olive on Facebook

- Go to Mount Olive's Facebook page and hold your mouse over the "like" button. If you have already liked the page you will see two options: "Post in News Feed" and "Notifications."
 - If you select "Post in News Feed" you will have a better chance of seeing the posts in your news feed. And, depending on your Facebook settings (e.g., "top stories" or "recent posts") and where you view your Facebook account (e.g., on a mobile device or desktop computer), the post may show up first in your feed.
 - If you select "Notifications," you will receive a notification on your personal profile each time we post an update.
- Visit the Mount Olive page by typing "Mount Olive Lutheran Church" in the search line of Facebook. This will take you directly to our page. Once there, you can see what has been posted, leave a comment or share a photo.






Lunch and Social Time Friday, February 12 Noon at Gramercy Complex


