Scapegoats Galore

In this season of Lent, our reflections often center on the sacrifice of Our Lord. We are reminded that God "made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in Christ we might become the righteousness of God." (II Cor. 5:21) This exchange, whereby an innocent party takes on the sins of a guilty party, is a practice which comes from the Hebrew tradition of the scapegoat. On Yom Kippur, the Day of Atonement, the high priest was presented with two goats. The priest then cast lots, and as a result, one goat was sacrificed as a sin offering, and one was presented alive, the sins of the people were symbolically put upon it, and it was sent into the wilderness. (Leviticus 16) As Christians, we understand that our sins were put on Christ when he went to the Cross; Christ acted as 'scapegoat', a dramatic example of God's love for the world. As St. John famously said, "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son..."

In this Lenten season our identity as those for whom Christ died also leads us to consider another connection we have with the term scapegoat. In the world today, scapegoats are common, but not in the religious sense. Today, a scapegoat is defined as one who bears the blame for things they did not do. Typically, when people are scared or discouraged, scapegoats are identified and blamed for the troubles of that people. Because scapegoats must be easily identified, they are often people with distinctive features, such as people of color, or people who speak a distinctive tongue, or have distinctive practices. In Nazi Germany in the 1930's, for example, the Jews were the scapegoats for all the troubles of the German people following WW I.

Today, in America, many people are scared and discouraged by what is going on in the world, and so the practice of scapegoating has reared its ugly head again. Muslims are the latest example of distinctive people who are being targeted as blameworthy for our troubles as a nation. African-Americans or Mexican-Americans, or other people of color, are also often targeted and blamed for what ills us. As people of faith, as people whose very salvation depends upon Jesus Christ, the Scapegoat for the World, we are called to stand with these people who are so unjustly blamed for the troubles of America. We are called to be a voice of hospitality and good will for all of God's children. In this season of reflection and repentance, you are invited into this call.




