As a lifelong Lutheran, one of my favorite ideas from the Reformation period is the concept that we are always reforming (or always being reformed) as the People of God. Recently on social media, this has been a trending discussion (check out #DecolonizeLutheranism). Many church leaders have been wrestling with what it means to be Lutheran in our current time and place. After all, as much as the Scandinavian traditions of the Upper Midwest have been long connected with the Lutheran branch of Christianity, there is a lot more to our faith than lefse and hotdishes! In an effort to broaden the scope of what it means to be Lutheran, one of the more helpful suggestions has been to intentionally open ourselves to new possibilities, and make room to do things differently as the Church going forward. Our broad diversity as of the People of God is unified in Christ more than anything.

Last week, I had the chance to be interviewed on a podcast that explores what this movement is beginning to look like, in practical terms, around the country. Three pastors hosted our chat: Kyle in Fort Worth, Texas; Lorne in Cincinnati, Ohio; and Alex in Minot, North Dakota. They were curious about how we as the people of Mount Olive are molding our Confirmation curriculum to be intergenerational, experiential, and, most importantly, a more meaningful experience than many of us had in our own Confirmation classes. It was a privilege to share about our Wednesday evening Metamorphosis gatherings, and all that they hold. As it turns out, Metamorphosis and other gatherings like it are carving out some important new space amidst the contemporary Church. It was inspiring to not only share with these faith leaders what we are learning here in Rochester, but also to listen to how they are breaking new ground in their own congregations,

too.





# Project Comfort Coffee June 25/26 Supports LWR Quilt & Shipping Fund

The Project Comfort Coffee is hosted each year by Ruth Circle to benefit LWR's Quilt and Shipping Fund. This fund is used to help defray the cost of shipping the guilts and kits to people in need all around the world. Members will serve homemade cookies and coffee after each worship service the weekend of June 25 and 26 and accept a freewill offering for the shipping fund. All offerings collected will go directly to LWR Quilt and Shipping Fund. In 2015, Mount Olive sent 100 quilts at shipping cost of \$2.25 per guilt, 67 baby care kits at a shipping cost of \$1.30 per kit and 65 personal care kits at a shipping cost of \$2.65 per kit.
