Where Were You?

Where were you on September 11, 2001? Any of us old enough to remember that day are old enough to remember where we were when the Twin Towers fell. The world changed that day. Metal detectors began showing up at airports. Barricades and closed streets soon surrounded federal buildings. Indeed, a whole new federal department – the Department of Homeland Security – was established because of that attack.

This year we will be observing the 15th anniversary of 9/11, so that day will be a day of remembrance. But we are not only pausing to remember and pray for those who died that day, and those they left behind. As important as that is; we are going to be the "lights of the world" that Jesus called us to be.

On that Sunday, designated as **God's Work, Our Hands Day**, members of congregations across the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America will spread out in acts of service and good-will in their own communities. At Mount Olive all are invited to worship at either 8:00 or 10:30 am. Following 8:00 worship, worshippers will be able to participate in a work project of their choosing – some more rigorous than others (see the list in this newsletter). Then at 11:30, these workers, along with the worshippers from the 10:30 service, will be able to enjoy lunch provided in the church fellowship hall. Then worshippers from the 10:30 service, in turn, following lunch, will take up their choice of service. What a great day this promises to be!

You should know that several of the projects planned for **God's Work**, **Our Hands Day** are designed to say thank you to our local first responders – our firefighters and medics. They certainly deserve our appreciation for all they do!

One other way we are going to let our lights shine that weekend is to receive a special offering for disaster victims in Baton Rouge, LA. The flooding they have endured is beyond imagination, and our gifts will go directly to Lutheran Disaster Response, one of the top relief agencies in the country, who will be serving the victims of this disaster for years to come. We ask you to make

out checks to Mount Olive with memo "flood relief."

Thank you for letting your light shine. Thank you for being the people through whom God's work is done. Thank you.



The book of Revelation has long been a source of confusion for Christians. The Reformers



viewed it as a commentary on the crises of their day, hence they identified the Pope as the Antichrist. Others have viewed that book as wholly symbolic, meant only to give encouragement to Christians of any time and place who live under persecution. Still others insist that the events pictured there have only to do with the events happening at the time of the book's writing. We will look at one scholar's view of this book – Bruce Metzger, distinguished professor emeritus at Princeton Seminary. Pastor Glenn leads this study Wednesdays at 6:30 pm beginning September 7. ETA-NEHISI COATES THE WORLD


AND ME
