Staff Restructuring is Full Steam Ahead

At their December meeting the Executive Council of Mount Olive endorsed 5 new job descriptions as drafted by Pastor Glenn, staff, and ministry teams. Some of these new job descriptions are merely rewrites of previous positions, while others are entirely new positions. One of the existing positions that was rewritten is Nancy Britson's position, which is now titled Director of Congregational Life. The result of this restructuring is that we will now have dedicated staff members for each of our four key ministry areas – Education, Worship, Service, and Fellowship, as well as administrative staff that is focused on our particular needs as a congregation. These new positions have been posted online and applications are being taken. Congregational members are welcome to apply. The positions being advertised are:

Director of Children, Youth and Family Ministries - full-time

Director of Missions, Service and Social Outreach - part-time

Media & Publications Designer – part-time

Webmaster & Administrative Assistant - part-time

Metamorphosis Returns Wednesday, January 18th

In this communal movement we are calling Metamorphosis, we are seeking to embody together the very theology of our Lutheran heritage, as, each Wednesday, we gather around the Word, engaging in dialogue around tables, and figure out what it means to be God's people. This practices emerges out of a deeply Lutheran understanding of what it means to reason out our faith with others. Luther did this with his table talks, as the Reformation took shape with a similar pattern of community gatherings through which God's people made sense out of a rapidly changing reality in their world.

The catechesis model we employ in Metamorphosis is an interactive, communal movement that makes room both for learning about and embodying the way of Jesus. It is an interpretive space that allows us not only to learn *about* the Lord's Prayer, the Creed, and the 10 Commandments, but it allows us to experience the implications of these teachings as we live them in our daily lives. It's a risky proposition to form relationships in this way across the usual boundaries of congregational life, but we think it is a risk worth taking. Through this Metamorphosis process, we hope that there will be room made for all of us to more fully live out our particularly Lutheran faith by rooting ourselves in Scripture as interpreted through a Gospel-centered Theology of the Cross (communal accompaniment and the work of justice). We won't always do this perfectly, but we hope that we will learn from our mistakes as we go.

All in all, we hope that together, this process will allow us to be both intellectually informed and holistically transformed as God's own beloved people.

Mount Olive's Inclement Weather Policy

When the snow flies and the wind chill is -20 degrees, is there still quilting group? Metamorphosis? Bible study? Here are the quick rule-of-thumb guides for winter weather.

- If school is cancelled because of inclement weather, all church activities, including evening activities, are cancelled
- If school dismisses early and community evening events are cancelled due to poor weather, all evening church activities are also cancelled
- Worship on Saturday night and Sunday is rarely cancelled. In the rare event that this occurs, we will have notification on our website, www.molive.org, and on the KTTC television channel.
- Always use your judgment before driving in bad weather. If MNDot advises no travel except in emergency cases, please assume that means church activities as well.
