Leave your empty cup in the basket provided.

THE LORD'S PRAYER

While we have only one version of the Lord's prayer printed in the bulletin, everyone is invited to say it aloud in any language or version of their choosing. We encourage opening the prayer with an image of God that is comforting and life-giving for you, including Our Mother, Our Father, Holy One, or Creator, to name a few.

CREEDS

When we recite creeds in worship, we are connected across time and place with the multitudes who have recited the same or similar words. We use different creeds from week to week as a way to acknowledge there are many different ways of expressing that in which we put our trust. Try not to think of creeds as a line in the sand – you're in, or you're out. Rather, think_of it as a time to be curious, and to place trust outside yourself and what you can comprehend.

Exercise Classes at Mount Olive

FREE exercise classes for people 55+ continue to meet twice weekly at Mount Olive. The "Stay Active and Independent for Life" (SAIL) classes are offered on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 3-4:00 pm in the Fellowship Hall. The classes are designed specifically for older adults and focus on strength, balance, flexibility and aerobics. All exercises and aerobics can be done sitting or standing and are very adaptive. Hearing Accessibility in Worship (Not just for those with hearing aids)

Mount Olive has recently installed state-of-the-art **Auracast Broadcast Audio**. Some hearing aids (certain models newer than 2024) have built-in ability to use Auracast with their hearing aid app. We also have hand-held receivers with earbuds (for those with or without hearing aids). These devices are available to pick up at the Welcome Desk. Today's smart phones also have little-known hearing accessibility features.
