Reflections and Thanks from Pastor Byron

What a joy it has been for me to be with you at Mount Olive for the first third of 2026! As I think back on my first days with you in January, I remember with appreciation how warmly you welcomed me. For many of you I was a complete stranger, but with some of you I had the opportunity to renew relationships that go back many years. I would like to share a few reflections as I look back on my four months at Mount Olive.

I have very much appreciated the depth of worship at Mount Olive. The services are prayerfully planned to provide worshipers with meaningful worship experiences that bring encouragement, comfort and challenge (and at times humor!) as together we seek to live faithfully as followers of Jesus Christ. Pastor Lisa, Deacon Travis, Psalmist Dr. Richard, all the lay volunteers, choir members, bells players, instrumentalists, artists and all the “behind the scenes” people use their many gifts to make each service a rich time as the faith community gathers together for worship and mutual encouragement. It has truly been a joy to worship with you these past months.

One of my responsibilities has been to make monthly calls on our more homebound members. It has been a privilege to visit with all of you and share our experiences of Holy Communion! In four short months we’ve had many wonderful conversations as you have opened your living spaces to me. At first, I was the guy who came in place of Pastor Glenn, but soon you welcomed me for just being me. Thank you!

For five weeks during the season of Lent, I led Wednesday evening and Sunday morning Bible studies, times of lively discussion around five biblical characters whose passion was lived out, each in their own unique ways. (continued inside on page 2)

Food Pantry Update



Thank you for the continued donations to help support the efforts of our food pantry here at Mount Olive. Your donations helped many people in our community get through a very difficult time. As our work with the community wide effort has come to an end we have been approached with a new opportunity to further reach those in need. We will now be

working with the Lutheran Social Service Youth Resource Center located at Zumbro Lutheran Church. This center helps provide food, hygiene items, and other necessities to youth that may be homeless or at risk of being homeless. We will be partnering with them to help provide some of these items. Our food pantries at Mount Olive will continue to be stocked, and we will also share items with the resource center. We will continue to accept shelf-stable, non-expired food items. Lenten and Easter Offerings Update

Our Soup Supper offerings were designated to ELCA World Hunger. \$2,167 was collected for this important ministry partner. Thank you to everyone who contributed donations toward the groceries and for the person who applied for a Thrivent grant. This helped to make the total contribution over \$1,000 more than 2025.

Thanks to your generous giving at midweek Lenten services, \$1,836.79 was collected for both COPAL and the Mount Olive Discretionary Fund, totaling \$3,673.58.

The Easter Sunday offerings supported Family Promise and The Landing MN. With a total offering of \$3,255.95, \$1627.98 will be distributed to each of these ministry partners.

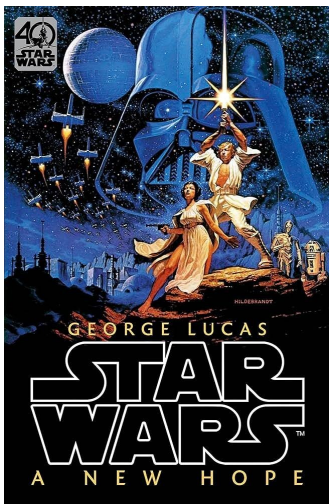
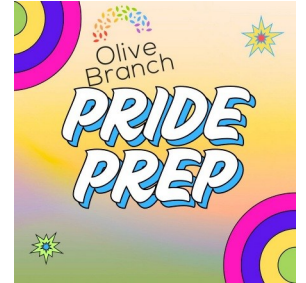
Sacramental Rest - Sunday, May 3, 4-5:00 pm, Fellowship Hall

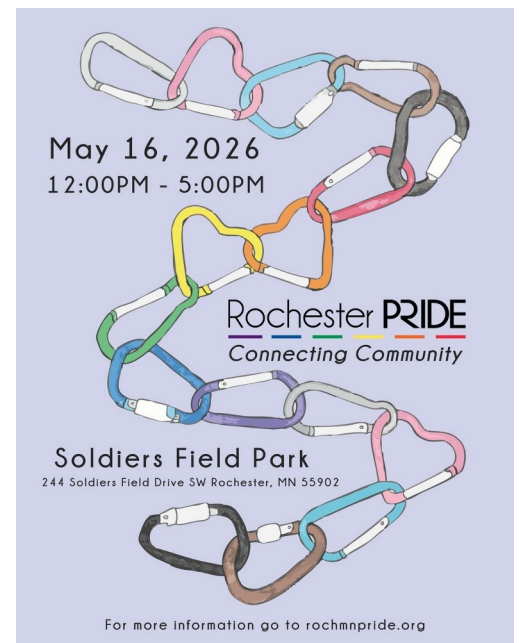

Women's Monthly Coffee Meet Up

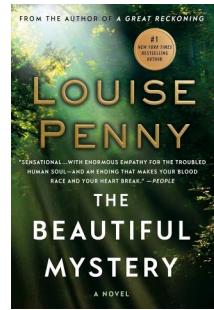
